I LOVE YOU



One of the best known days in February is Valentine's Day, even in a Leap year! Some people are tempted to call February 14 "Hallmark Holiday." Little wonder because in our country over 7 billion valentine cards are purchased yearly. Most of these cards say "I love you" in one way or another. But what does "I love you" mean?

Some would say it refers to being attracted to someone. While it is true that attractiveness can draw people together, we need to remember that physical attractiveness changes over time. Yes, it is an important kind of love, but it does not have the same sustaining love as other forms of love.

Others would say that "I love you" means you are my friend. Good friends are true blessings in this life as we find things that we enjoy doing with certain people we like and with whom we have so much in common. A friendship kind of love is very special but, sadly, we know from experience that friends come and go.



There is a deeper understanding of what it means to say "I love you." The word that comes to mind for many Christians is "*agape*" which we call *God's kind of love*. It is unconditional grace and keeps reaching out to other people even when they may not understand or return this kind of love. That is certainly true of God's love for us sinners. Even when we say and do sinful things, God's serving and giving love reaches out to us. As the Bible teaches, "while we were yet sinners Christ died for us." Jesus himself said, "Greater love has no one than that he lay down his life for his friends."



I Corinthians 13 describes *agape* love in this way, "Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, and it keeps no record of wrongs. Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, and always perseveres. Love never fails."

The Apostle John writes, "How great is the love the Father has lavished on us that we should be called the children of God! And that is what we are!" Good and godly children imitate the positive characteristics of their good and godly parents. As children of Christ, we imitate the love of our Father in heaven. "We love because He first loved us."

Our Lord delights in loving by giving and serving our daily needs. Empowered by the Holy Spirit, we are God's children. There is no better witness to what it means to be a child of God than for us to use all of life and life's resources in a way that brings glory to God and blessings to those whose lives we touch. May our "I love you" always be Jesus' kind of love, a serving and giving love.

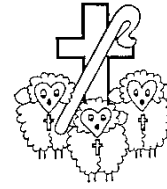
It comes out to almost the same amount of time but fewer days. This seems to make it easier on busy schedules. Please join us.

Enrollment has started for the next school year, so if you know any little ones looking for a loving preschool, please let them know of SCCC!!!

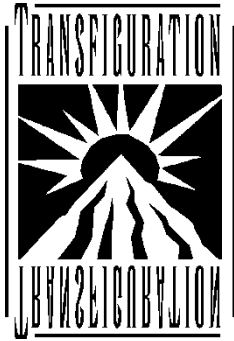

The Transfiguration of our Lord will be celebrated on Sunday, February 19.

Jesus led Peter, James and John up a high mountain to pray and as Jesus was praying, He was transfigured before them.

Transfigured - What does that mean?

- His clothes became dazzling white.
- Elijah and Moses were talking to Him.
- A cloud appeared and enveloped Him.
- A voice came from a cloud saying "This is my Son whom I love. Listen to Him."

They looked around and no one was with them (Peter, James, and John) except Jesus. As He was praying, the appearance of His face changed, and his clothes became as bright as a flash of lightning. Two men, Moses and Elijah, appeared in glorious splendor, talking to Jesus.

As they were coming down the mountain, Jesus gave them orders not to tell anyone what they had seen until the Son of Man had risen from the dead. (Matt. 17:1-3, Mark 9:2-9, Luke 9:28-36).

The Old Testament law stated that three witnesses were required to an event and this law was satisfied at the Transfiguration both on earth and in heaven - on earth with Peter, James, and John there, and in heaven with Moses, Elijah, and the voice of God from heaven (Deut. 19:5).

The word "Transfigured" is from a Greek word metamorpho" which means to transform literally, figuratively, or to change.

The voice of God attesting to the truth of Jesus' Sonship was the second time God's voice was heard. The first time was at Jesus' Baptism into his public ministry by John the Baptist. (Matt. 3:7), Mark 1:11, Luke 3:22).

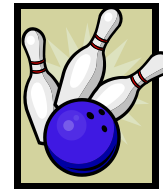

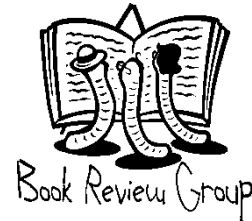

Altar Guild Corner

Good Shepherd has an Altar Guild currently consisting of 17 members. Most are women but we are pleased to have several guys as well. They take turns either setting up the altar for the communion services each week or they clean up following the services. They serve once a month, are assigned to a specific week, and always know which Sunday they are on duty.

As chair of the group, I have decided to periodically include articles about what is done in the guild since for the most part it is a quiet ministry that almost goes unnoticed. The members are extremely dedicated, efficient and do their jobs behind the scenes. When you come in for church, the set up crew has already been busy and things are ready to go for the service. Following each service, the clean up people go to work. They remove all communion-ware from the altar, check linens for soil, dispose of unused wine by pouring it on the ground outside the building, and wash up each piece that was used. Now and then wine is spilled on the white linens and thus each week, something needs to be laundered. Every piece has a name which I will explain in a future article, along with its purpose. Other future subjects to be covered are liturgical colors and why they change, how communion is set up, the Paschal and Presence candles, Baptisms, what the family receives at a baptism, and why, who serves on the guild, and the things done by the board chair that other members do not do.

If you have any questions, please contact me. If I don't already know the answer, I will look it up. I have overseen the guild for approximately 15 years, something I have very much enjoyed doing.

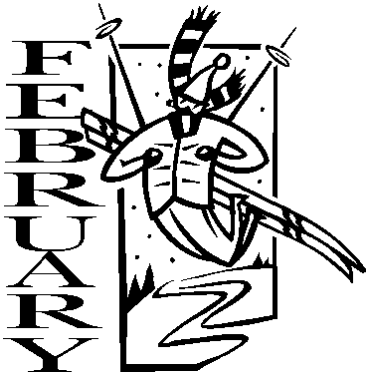
